SCHOOL BUS

Regular School Bus Information

The final touches are being placed on the bus routes at this time. If a family has just been accepted to SCS in the last week or two and requires school bus transportation, they may be added if there is a school bus route in their area and if there is room on that bus. No new bus registrations are being accepted for returning students at this time. Families may be added to a wait list but there are no guarantees that a space will be available.

Drivers will contact families with the pick-up time and place before the first day of school. If you have not heard anything by September 7, contact the Combined Christian School Transportation Association (CCSTA) at admin@ccsta.net or call 778-986-9011. For those who are new to the bus system, please be aware that it often takes a few days for the routes to fall into a rhythm so you may choose to make alternate arrangements for the first day or two of class just in case.

Deadline to Cancel the School Bus

Please note that if you registered to ride the bus and your circumstances change, you have until September 30 to inform the office without incurring a penalty. After that date you will be required to pay the monthly bus fee regardless of whether your child is riding the bus or not as the school is invoiced from the bus company based on the rider list on October 1.

Shuttle Bus

There is free shuttle bus service between Cloverdale and the Fleetwood/Secondary campuses. Parents must have registered for the free shuttle before the end of June 2021. **There is no hop-on service available** as drivers must have a complete list of students who are riding the shuttle bus for contact tracing purposes. Shuttle leaves Cloverdale Campus at 7:55 am for the Fleetwood and Secondary campuses and returns to Cloverdale Campus in the afternoon at approximately 3:25 pm.

The bus company is not able to offer shuttle service between the Fleetwood Campus and the Secondary Campus this year.

COVID 19 Safety Update

- (1) The bus company will follow the school's directive in terms of whether masks will be required. The school is currently waiting for directive from the Provincial Health Officer.
- (2) Students should wash their hands before they leave home and when they leave school prior to taking the bus.
- (3) Buses will be cleaned and disinfected in accordance with BCCDC guidelines.
- (4) All garbage cans have been removed from buses. There is no food or drink allowed to be consumed on the school bus.
- (5) Buses will be loaded from back to front and offloaded from front to back. Students are encouraged to walk to their seat without touching the seats as they pass.
- (6) Buses will be limited to a maximum of 2 students per seat.
- (7) CCSTA will use assigned seating and keep an up-to-date passenger list to share with public health should contact tracing need to occur. Families will sit together, and other students will share seats. No extra students will be allowed to ride the bus.
- (8) To keep travel time on the bus at a minimum, some stops have been adjusted.

ABSENCES & LATE ARRIVAL

Please be sure to inform the school office by 9:00 am if your child will be absent from school. Call 604-581-1033 for Secondary Campus, 604-576-6313 for Cloverdale Campus or 604-581-7073 for Fleetwood Campus. You may also email absent@surreychristian.com to report your child's absence. If a student comes late to school, he/she must sign in at the office. To ensure a late is excused, parents should either send a note or phone the school.

SCHOOL CLOSURE

In the rare event that school is to be closed because of unsafe weather conditions or a power outage, please check your email, the school website or social media. Announcements will also be made on CKNW (AM980) and Global BC. The administration aims to make the decision by 6:30 am. It is not advised to Google "snow day Surrey Christian School" as that may bring up outdated and inaccurate posts from previous years.

If you wish to contact your child's teacher via email, use the first initial of the teacher's first name and then type the last name with the extension @surreychristian.com. For example: Jane Smith = jsmith@surreychristian.com.

MYSCHOOL MANAGEMENT

Every Grade 8-12 student, and every parent of K-12 children, needs to have an active MySchool account, our online system that tracks all student information. Most announcements from teachers or the office will be emailed home via MySchool, and learning reports are posted to MySchool each term. Hard copies of learning reports are also sent home with students at the K-7 grade levels. At the Grade 8-12 level teachers use it to post homework assignments, grades, permission slips etc.

New parents who did not apply online via MySchool will be supplied with a password and login link in late August/early September. Members joining part way through a 5-year period will pay a pro-rated portion of the 5-year fee (\$10 per year or \$50 for a full 5-year membership). So, if you are applying to become a member this year the fee is \$10 and your membership renewable in the fall of 2022. **If you are applying to become a society member for the first time your application will go to the school board for approval.**

KINDERGARTEN SPECIFIC

Dear Parents:

It was a blessing to meet many of you at the kindergarten orientation that took place in June. We look forward to partnering with you as your child begins their journey at Surrey Christian School.

First day of school for kindergarten students is on Tuesday, September 7. Students will be dismissed at 12:00 pm. Please note that every Friday school starts at 9:15 am at the Fleetwood Campus, and 9:25 am at the Cloverdale Campus.

GRADUAL ENTRY

From September 7-24, all kindergarten classes will be in session from 8:45 am until 12:00 pm allowing the teachers to visit with children and their families in the afternoons.

Full days for all kindergarten students commence the week of September 27, 2021. There will be no bus service home for kindergarten students in September when school ends at 12:00 pm so please plan for your child to be picked up.

WHAT TO BRING

We would like each child to bring the following items to school on their first day:

- Indoor shoes that stay at school. Please find shoes that are easy for your child to put on (i.e. velcro). These should be appropriate for gym.
- Drawstring bag with a complete extra set of clothing, including socks and underwear. **Please label** the bag and each item.
- Backpack for papers and books. It should be large enough to fit a 9x12 folder.
- Earthquake Kit: Please follow the instructions on the enclosed "Comfort Kit" insert.
- Copy of your child's immunization record once your child has completed their kindergarten booster shot.

It is very important that you label everything with your child's name. If you have any questions, please contact the school office, or speak to your child's teacher in early September.

SCHOOL SUPPLIES

- Bibles: Grade 4 students and new students in Grade 5, 6 and 7 will receive an NIV Bible from the school. Returning Grade 5, 6 and 7 students should bring the bible they received in Grade 4.
- Binders may be requested by the classroom teacher for Grade 4-7 students.
- Music class information will be sent home with Grade 4-7 students in the first week of school.
- Earthquake Kits are required for all students. Please see [Comfort Kit](#) section for more information.
- Students are to have both indoor and outdoor shoes. Indoor shoes should be non-scuff and suitable for PE activities. Flip flops, high heeled runners and thin slip-on runners are not suitable for indoor or outdoor activities. Skates, skateboards or shoes with wheels are not allowed.

PARKING LOT

Parking guidelines are under currently under review as a new temporary parking lot is being constructed.

Parents are responsible for their vehicle and their children. Please do not let your child run through the parking lot; walk with them and be aware that children are everywhere. Please be cautious.

Please respect “no parking” signs on the west side of 162nd Street directly across from the school.

Please respect crossing guards and never try to “beat” a stop sign. All parents and children need to cross at the crossing guard station.

When walking to the primary building from the street or top of parking lot, use the sidewalk along the middle building. Do not use the parking lot as a walk way to or from the primary building.

- Please back into your stall if possible
- Do not cut behind cars that are backing in
- Be patient
- Follow people directing traffic
- Maximum 10 km/hr in parking lot
- Wait until you are parked to let your child out of the car

EARTHQUAKE COMFORT KITS FOR FLEETWOOD AND CLOVERDALE CAMPUSES

It is time once again to prepare an “Earthquake Comfort Kit” for your Grade K-7 child to provide him/her with some of the resources that he/she will need to stay comfortable should an earthquake or other disaster occur while at school.

Making the Comfort Kit:

- Please use a medium sized Ziploc bag.

- Include a sealed bottle of water.
- Food items should be high energy, ready-to-eat, and non-perishable. Consider nut-free granola bars, dried fruit or fruit leather. Comfort foods such as a few hard candies or cookies are also appropriate.
- Include a 12-hour light stick if possible.
- You may also include a short note to your child and a family picture.

Be sure that all items can fit into the Ziploc bag and return it to your child's teacher by **Friday September 17, 2021**. All bags will be placed in plastic bins and kept in each classroom. The kits will be returned to the students at the end of the school year.

FIRST DAY

The first day of school is Tuesday, September 7 from 8:45 am to 12:00 pm. The buses will run on the normal schedule for an 8:35 am start time, giving a 10 minute 'buffer' for late arrivals. At 8:45 am Period 1 will begin for all students. Schedules are available for students on MySchool and they will be posted around the school building.

*Crew is a group of 15-17 students within your grade that meets twice weekly and focuses on building strong relationships. Alphabetical listings will be posted near entrances to help all students identify which Crew they are in and where they meet.

SCHEDULE CHANGES

Students should be able to access their schedules through MySchool before the beginning of the school year. Student schedules have been created based on student choices, their past achievement in their classes, balancing class sizes, and the teaching timetable. Occasionally a factor such as taking a summer school course may impact the original students' choices, however, there is an expectation that students commit to what they have chosen. Changing or dropping courses after classes have begun is only possible in exceptional cases such as health or personal situations.

To assure balanced and accurate schedules students are asked to look at all their courses in MySchool from September to June. If you have any questions or concerns about your schedule, please email one of our academic counsellors. Students in Grade 8, 11 and 12 can contact Carmen Meier at cmeier@surreychristian.com. Students in Grade 9 and 10 can contact Sue Alberts at salberts@surreychristian.com. Also, if there is an unexplained blank in a student's schedule, it is important to see the academic counselor as soon as possible to add a class.

SIGN-OUT PROCEDURE

SCHOOL SUPPLIES

PERSONAL DEVICE

Every student in Grade 8-12 requires a personal device for classroom use. New students should have received an email in June with a link to the order form for three options to be purchased through the school, or you may supply your own device.

FALCONS ATHLETICS

There are many opportunities for students to be involved in extracurricular athletics at both the secondary and elementary campuses. However, last year COVID-19 caused the athletic department to re-think and plan for a different athletic program, especially with the restriction of no inter-school competition. Our hope is inter-school competition will begin again this current school year however we will need to wait for approval from ministry of education and health and sport authorities. Regardless of what is determined in terms of inter-school competition, we will continue to provide learning experiences in a safe environment in after school sports for our students. We are excited to continue to have staff and volunteers teach student athletes our core values of respect, commitment, encouragement, gratitude, and growth.

Athletic fees are applicable for teams at the secondary level. These fees are used primarily to offer the coach volunteers a stipend. An email will be sent to you requesting payment after your child has made a commitment and been selected to be on a team. This is where you will also sign off on the "Assumption of Risk" form acknowledging the risks associated with that sport.
